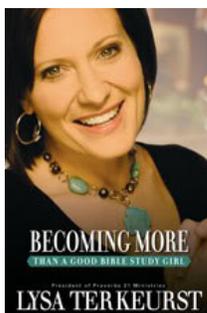
- Sense God responding to your prayers.

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Interview Questions for Lysa TerKeurst

Author of *Becoming More Than a Good Bible Study Girl*

1. Your book is called *Becoming More Than a Good Bible Study Girl*. But, isn't it good to be involved in Bible study? Why should a woman want more?
2. Oprah Winfrey has interviewed you twice on her TV show and described you as one the most inspiring family stories in the history of her program. How does raising your family relate to becoming more than a good Bible study girl?
3. In your book, you are extremely honest and open on painful topics, such as your abortion and sexual abuse as a child. What do you hope comes out of sharing your story?
4. Your little sister Hayley died when you were in college. You wrote that when she passed away, you "vowed you would never love God, serve God, or believe in God again." What is the most important thing you learned in this grief? How did your faith change?
5. In Chapter 12, you describe a time when it felt like God hurt your feelings. Explain what you mean by this idea and how many women struggle with the same issue?
6. Women have so many messages thrown at them – what they should look like, how they should parent, what they should be able to handle. It's easy to get caught in a cycle of jealousy, looking at other women's achievements and comparing them to their own. How does one combat this?
7. You write about "learning to like yourself." When did you come to a point of liking yourself? What advice do you have for women who struggle with self-hatred or low self-esteem?
8. Your book mentions "a glorious sense of possibility" where God intervened in frustrating circumstances on your way to a speaking engagement. Can you share your thoughts on "the divine mixed into our mundane?"
9. What advice do you have for women who want to take the "next step" in their faith and experience Christ like never before?



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
